Diagnosing Difference: Transgender and Genderqueer Perspectives

Featuring interviews with 13 diverse scholars, activists, and artists who identify on the trans spectrum (transgender, transsexual, genderqueer, and gender variant), this feature-length documentary explores the impact and implications of the Gender Identity Disorder (GID) on their lives and communities. With a personal rather than medical approach, Diagnosing Difference seeks to expand the experience of the audience, provoke thought, and create as many questions as answers

Telling Our Stories

Two short films, one narrative and one documentary, explore how youth approach LGBT history and politics. In *Change*, an African-American teenager grapples with his sexual identity on the night Barack Obama is elected president and Proposition 8 is passed. In *Don't Erase My History*, Bay Area youth search for the past that has no name in schools. In a world where queer history has often been erased, what will they discover?

Brother Outsider: The Life of Bayard Rustin

The winner of more than 25 international awards, *Brother Outsider* illuminates the life and work of Bayard Rustin, a visionary activist and strategist who has been called "the unknown hero" of the civil rights movement. A tireless crusader for justice, a disciple of Gandhi, a mentor to Martin Luther King Jr., and the architect of the legendary 1963 March on Washington, Rustin dared to live as an openly gay man during the fiercely homophobic 1940s, 1950s, and 1960s. Outsider reveals the price that Rustin paid for this openness, chronicling both the triumphs and setbacks of his remarkable 60-year career.
