Queer Youth Advocacy Day



Queer Youth Advocacy Day is a student-led day of action in California's State Capitol. Over the last decade, thousands of young people from every corner of California have rallied on the Capitol steps in Sacramento, calling on lawmakers to make California schools safer for LGBTQ and straight ally students.

At Queer Youth Advocacy Day, GSA youth activists meet with representatives from their districts to educate them about important issues facing LGBT youth. During these meetings, youth leaders advocate for laws and policies that will make schools safer.

Through events like Queer Youth Advocacy Day, GSA activists played a leadership role in

passing ground-breaking, statewide legislation including, The California Student Safety and Violence Prevention Act of 2000, AB 537, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of sexual orientation and gender identity, the law establishing Harvey Milk Day in California, the Mental Health Access for At-Risk Youth law and the FAIR Education Act.

Queer Youth Advocacy Day 2011

Queer Youth Advocacy Day 2011 took place on April 4th, 2011 in Sacramento.

GSA youth advocates were in Sacramento to fight for three groundbreaking laws:

1. **Seth's Law (AB 9)** - Named after Seth Walsh, a 13 year-old student from Tehachapi, California, who committed suicide in September following years of anti-gay bullying at school, this law will provide California schools with specific tools to prevent and address bullying.
2. **FAIR Education Act (SB 48)** - The Fair, Accurate, Inclusive, and Respectful (FAIR) Education Act will ensure that the positive contributions of lesbian, gay, bisexual and transgender people are fairly and accurately included in classroom materials, which studies show is linked to greater student safety and lower rates of bullying.
3. **Gender Nondiscrimination Act (AB 887)** - AB 887 will place "gender identity and expression" alongside other protected categories in our non-discrimination laws, helping people to understand the law and effectively address discrimination against transgender people.
