On **November 20th**, people throughout the world will memorialize those who have lost their lives to transphobic violence. Transgender and gender non-conforming communities are disproportionately targeted by acts of hate violence. **Transgender Day of Remembrance gives us pause to recognize the toll this violence has on our communities and to remember those who we have lost.** The day is held in November to honor **Rita Hester**, who was murdered in 1998. Rita's death sparked the creation of the [Remembering Our Dead](#) ^[1] website, and subsequently an annual candlelight vigil starting in San Francisco, CA.
