

This year's theme is "Resiliency at the Intersections"

The NorCal Youth Council, comprised of GSA youth leaders in Northern California, selected the theme of "Resiliency at the Intersections." They wanted to center and bring visibility to trans and queer people of color, prevent the erasure of intersectional identities, and to fight for racial justice within the LGBTQ community. In light of the Pulse tragedy in Orlando and the continual violence against our communities, they wanted to lift up the resiliency and power of trans/queer people of color at YES 2016.
